In a significant boost for early literacy, the Jharkhand Education Project Council (JEPC) has adopted 60 Room to Read storybooks and distributed them to **35,000 schools** across the state reaching approx. **25 lakh children**. These engaging books are designed to cultivate a love of reading and build essential language skills in young learners. Teachers are enthusiastically incorporating these new resources, encouraging enjoyable and meaningful reading experiences for children across Jharkhand.
