Understanding Need for Books

In the initial years, the ability to read is the foundation for all future learning.

Reading opens doors to the independent and dynamic exploration of knowledge. It contributes to active and mindful interaction with language in different social and cultural contexts.

Stories and storytelling come naturally to us, but reading is an acquired skill that must be learned. It requires engagement with purposeful, meaningful, and early print activities. Unfortunately, there is a huge scarcity of quality children's books. High-quality, culturally relevant children's literature is often limited or non-existent in low-income countries. Books for beginners or early readers are the most neglected. This scarcity deepens when we look at quality children's literature in regional languages.



The lack of good reading material/books in the countries where we work impelled Room to Read to start publishing local-language books in 2005.

Book Publishing Program

We at Room to Read India believe that 'reading well' is not just the effective mastering of text decoding and comprehension skills. There is a need for a stronger focus on effective reading processes – motivation, enjoyment of books, and engagement with language and stories if we are to make a substantive long-term change to children's reading and make them **lifelong readers**. We also believe that if children can easily and independently find a wide variety of engaging books appropriate to their reading level and language, they are more likely to become lifelong readers. Our **Book Publishing Program** ensures age-appropriate and culturally relevant books in local languages that readers can enjoy at various development levels of their reading skills.



Ideal Book Collection

The library is one of the significant components of Room to Read India's Comprehensive Literacy Program. We transform school libraries into a childfriendly learning environment with diverse and engaging books that inspire children to read. To ensure an expansive collection of books for our libraries, we invite books from local publishers to screen and shortlist under our 'Ideal Collection Development' policy.

To accomplish this, we organize an 'Ideal Book Collection' (IBC) Event where reputed publishers offer their book collections. These books undergo a rigorous review process by an expert committee including educationists, school principals, primary teachers, parents/community members, children's literature experts (authors, illustrators, publishers, editors), and people from NGOs working in similar spaces.

The event helps Room to Read India to source an ideal collection from the available resources in the market and also allows us to analyze where the most significant gaps are in the collection and identify insufficient resources available for a particular level or theme.

Room to Read India also conducts a 'Publisher's Meet' to discuss the major gaps and needs in children's literature.

Room to Read India actively supports state governments in creating their Ideal Book Collections to build grassroots-level capacity in identifying quality children's literature.

Author and Illustrator Workshops

Room to Read India's Book Publishing Program initiative's primary focus is reducing the gap for non-available material in the market. Analyzing the findings from the 'Ideal Book Collection' event helps us identify the need we cannot meet through procured books from local publishers.

Under the Book Publishing Program, we organize Author and Illustrator workshops to create new storybooks. Local authors and illustrators are invited to the workshop to promote local talent. Certain themes remain unexplored in Indian children's literature, and we also ask the authors to work on these themes to address the gaps in the market. Facilitators hold very focused sessions for participants to build their understanding of target readers, story ideas, editing techniques, storyboarding, and relatable characters.

Before publishing any book, we 'Field Test' these books with children to get feedback on the storyline, subject appropriateness, engagement, and reading difficulty. The testing also helps us to level these books as per our GROWBY* color-coded book leveling system.

Over the years, Room to Read India has received honors for best illustrations, best children's books, and book excellence. We have also been awarded the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) Confucius Prize for Literacy (2011) for improving literacy by utilizing the local resources across all its countries of operation. In India, we have received the Federation of Indian Publishers Award for three years in a row.

Room to Read India, alone, is credited with publishing 226 Original Titles.

These titles have been published in many Indian languages

Hindi, Marathi, Gujarati, Telugu, and Kannada.

Books have also been published in a few other languages

English, Urdu, Chhattisgarhi, Bundeli, Garhwali, and Rajasthani.

We have also published in tribal languages such as

Ho, Mundari, Kudukh, Santhali, Khadiya, Surgujiya, and Halbi.

6,197,356 books were printed and distributed across schools under Room to Read India's Book Publishing Program till December 31, 2022.

We have also uploaded books on **DIKSHA and other government platforms** to enable digital access to some of our titles.

The trends from 2018 to 2022 show a steady rise in the number of books being checked out by children across our libraries in India.



Partnering with State Governments

Room to Read India supports State Governments in their endeavor to promote literacy among multilingual children by conducting workshops. We also build capacities of teachers and government officials, to elevate the discourse around reading and various aspects of children's literature, such as identifying good literature, the importance of stories, etc. This contributes to significant systemic and on-the-ground changes.

The Chhattisgarh government collaborated with Room to Read India to help them develop 10 new titles in six local languages.

In Jharkhand, books were adapted into five different tribal languages- Ho, Mundari, Kudukh, Santhali, and Khadiya.

We have extended our support to provide licenses to the Delhi, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh and Uttarakhand state governments to print, publish and distribute our books as part of their Early Childhood Care Education kits.
