The India Coalition for Gender-Equal Education

With the belief that children recognize their sense of self-worth through dignified and gender-equal learning, Room to Read India is playing a lead role in the *Gender Transformative Education (GTE) Collaborative – India Coalition for Education for Gender Equality*. This powerful initiative, steered by Breakthrough India and the United Nations Girls' Education Initiative (UNGEI), is working to shape the national vision and advancement around gender transformative education.



This quarter, a major highlight was the Coalition's Launch Event on August 5, 2025. We co-hosted a key panel on *Embedding Gender Equality through Government Systems and Partnerships*, bringing together diverse voices from officials, civil society organizations and young adolescents. Further solidifying our influence, our *Country Director*, Poornima Garg, contributed expert insights to a forthcoming national study on the State of Education for Gender Equality in India.

This collaborative is a collective movement with the vision of developed India with an equal, enabling and inclusive environment in and through education.

My Book, My Story: Celebrating Children's Literature



On September 15, 2025, we hosted a national event in New Delhi to culminate our seventh edition of the Reading Campaign and third edition of the Room to Read Children's Literature Awards.

<u>Inaugurated by our Country Director</u>, <u>Poornima Garg</u>; we had the opportunity to host <u>our CEO</u>, <u>Dr. Geetha Murali</u>, our <u>Board Members</u> Mr. Anshu Prakash and Mr. Gaurav Dalmia and the privilege of hearing the Keynote Address by an award-winning author Paro Anand and <u>Special Address on evolving landscape in Marathi literature by Harshal Korhale</u> at the event.

The event also brought together authors, educators and policymakers exploring **how dignity, diversity and emotional well-being can be nurtured through children's books**. Recognizing young creators in Hindi and Marathi languages through the Children's Literature Awards 2025 felicitation ceremony and witnessing a live theatre performance were the key highlights from the event. **Read more.**

Room to Read India at UKFIET 2025!



We had a significant influence at the recent UKFIET Conference in Oxford, UK, sharing key insights into educational equity and foundational literacy.

Our *Program Operations Director* **Rishi Rajvanshi** shared powerful lessons on sustaining foundational literacy at scale, tracing the successful transition of Project SERI to a scaled-up government-owned model.

State Manager **Pushplata Rawat** presented findings from a joint Gender Landscape study in Uttarakhand, making a strong case for mainstreaming gender perspectives from the foundational years.

Additionally, *National Program Coordinator for QRM*, **Deepali Agarwal** led a vital workshop on Curating Inclusive Libraries, encouraging reflection on gaps and opportunities in children's book curation.

Building Creativity: Learning Through Play Workshop

We recently hosted an inspiring *Learning Through Play* workshop led by Victoria Yim from the LEGO Foundation. The one-day session showcased how learning can be joyful, imaginative and engaging. Bringing together educators and students, it explored creative ways to transform classrooms into inclusive and collaborative spaces that nurture curiosity and creativity. **Read more.**



Bringing Life Skills Education to Boys

For over two decades, we focused on delivering vital Life Skills Education to adolescent girls. This year marks a major expansion as we begin including boys through three innovative Test Programs: LifeSkills for Equality Project, Financial Literacy Initiative for Adolescents and Climate Justice Leadership Program.





These programs equip educators with highquality curriculum content and facilitation guidance. This past quarter, we built strong momentum through government-led content-vetting workshops and regular implementation across classrooms in multiple states. This comprehensive approach, supported by community involvement, is building strong networks for adolescents' holistic development.

#IndiaGetsReading 7.0: My Book, My Story

The seventh edition of the campaign, themed *My Book, My Story*, powerfully connected with diverse audiences. For children, it created a space to express their thoughts freely; for caregivers, teachers, officials, and partners, it was a collective call to amplify every child's voice and promote inclusive learning. Anchored in the belief that every child deserves to read with dignity, the campaign featured vibrant activities such as Mobile Library Vans, Pledge Reading Time, and the <u>Read-a-thon</u> — a nationwide celebration that as per early estimates engaged over *39 lakh participants**.


From Books to Brilliance

#WatchNow: Meet Vaishnavi, a Grade 4 student in Madhya Pradesh, whose world was quietly transformed by reading. Books became a vibrant bridge, fostering a love for learning that empowered her to chase new goals. This is a story of how small changes in a child's environment can lead to achieving bigger dreams.

Footprints from Rajasthan

Our three-year (2022-25) Literacy Instruction Scale-up Program in Jodhpur, Rajasthan, has derived major success in over 2,600 schools. Evaluation shows program students achieved four times the gain in Oral Reading Fluency (ORF) compared to peers from comparison schools, increasing by an impressive 24.5 correct words per minute.

The program also sharply reduced the number of non-readers by 25 percentage points, making students 3–4 times more likely to hit official fluency benchmarks — a clear demonstration of effective foundational literacy at scale.

Creative Collaboration with BNP Paribas in Mumbai

On July 7, 2025, we hosted 37 volunteers from BNP Paribas India Solutions in Mumbai for a creative session supporting our Girls' Education Program (GEP). The volunteers were engaged in poster-making activity. Focused on vital topics like Cyber Safety, Mental Health and Emotional Awareness, these posters are now displayed in Life Skills Centres to spark conversations and inspire adolescents in grades 6–12.



U.S. Educators Observe Our Library Program in New Delhi

On July 8, 2025, we proudly hosted 19 U.S. educators from the *Fulbright Teachers for Global Classrooms (TGC) Program* at a Delhi school for an immersive look at our Library Program.

The Fulbright scholars toured a library established by Room to Read (2019–2022), learning about the core components that drive our success: age-appropriate storybooks, print-rich child-friendly spaces and sustainability via ongoing teacher training and student-led Library Management Committees. Educators were particularly impressed by the seamless integration of library practices into weekly classroom routines and the use of our digital repository, Literacy Cloud.



Learning from Mission Ankur: Jharkhand Delegation Visits Madhya Pradesh



Room to Read India and JEPC collaborated on a three-day exposure visit to Madhya Pradesh for 14 Key Resource Persons (KRPs) from Jharkhand to observe the successful implementation of the Mission Ankur Project.

The Jharkhand team visited schools to witness effective multi-grade literacy and numeracy classes firsthand.

They gained a practical understanding of early grade reading and the use of multilingual education (MLE) content, including the innovative books developed in Madhya Pradesh. KRPs received a full strategic overview by interacting with state officials, the District Magistrate, supportive supervision staff (CACs/BACs) and DIET faculties. These crucial learnings will now be used by the KRPs back in Jharkhand to address local challenges in multilingual and multigrade classrooms.
